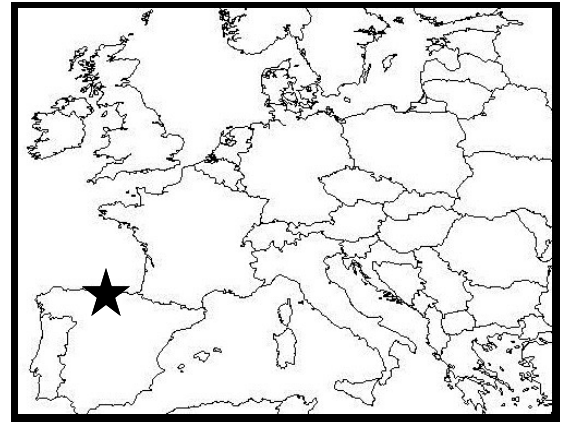

## PROGRAM

International Studies Abroad (ISA) offers beginning, intermediate, and advanced level students the opportunity to study Spanish in Santander. Approximately 5,000 students study at Menéndez Pelayo International University. ISA provides orientation, housing, on-site support, and excursion to participants on the program.

## ACADEMICS

The *Spanish Language, Culture, and Electives in English* program Menéndez Pelayo International University offers a language course at each level as well as courses taught in English in business, history, and international relations. Your classmates will be other international students. Students may earn between 18 and 22 quarter credits on the program. ## LOCATION: SANTANDER, SPAIN

Santander (pop. 220,000) is located in northern Spain on the Bay of Biscay, and is characterized as a modern and elegant city. Perhaps best known for its beautiful beaches, the city also boasts excellent seafood and a varied nightlife. Santander is an excellent location for immersion, as there are fewer U.S. students studying abroad here than in many other DU study abroad sites in Spain.

## HOUSING & MEALS

Most students choose to live with host families carefully selected by ISA's resident staff. Living with a host family is an excellent way to become immersed in Spanish culture and improve your Spanish language skills. Meals are provided in the home stay setting. *Residencias* are a second housing option; a meal plan at the dining hall is included. You may not select independent housing. Meals on program excursions may be extra.

## CULTURAL CONNECTIONS

The program excursions provide ample opportunity to explore Spain's wealth of architecture, culture heritage, music, and scenery. In addition, the on-site resident staff can help you identify other opportunities to interact with the local community, such as *intercambios* (conversation partners) and other extracurricular activities. Your host family will also be a great connection to the local culture.

# HOW TO APPLY

⇒ **Attend Study Abroad 101**

Held weekdays at the I-House. See website for schedule ([www.du.edu/intl/abroad/info\\_sessions.html](http://www.du.edu/intl/abroad/info_sessions.html)).

⇒ **Attend a Regional Advising Session**

Mandatory if you are considering Spain. See website for schedule (same link as above).

⇒ **Meet with an international education advisor**

Learn about your options and get answers to your questions.

⇒ **Apply for a passport—<http://travel.state.gov/passport>**

If you already have one, make sure you know where it is and when it expires.

⇒ **Apply to study abroad!**

- DU short-answer essays
- Official transcript(s) from other universities attended, if applicable
- Non-Cherrington students will be charged a \$50 application fee to their DU account.

**Note:** *Cherrington status may be revoked at any time due to a change in your student conduct or academic status. Also, the OIE will request your DU transcript; check and clear any holds now to avoid delays in processing your application!*

## PROGRAM APPLICATION: DUE AFTER YOU'VE BEEN NOMINATED

Once you have been nominated for this program, you will be required to submit the following:

- Printed confirmation email from ISA (you receive this after completing your online application)
