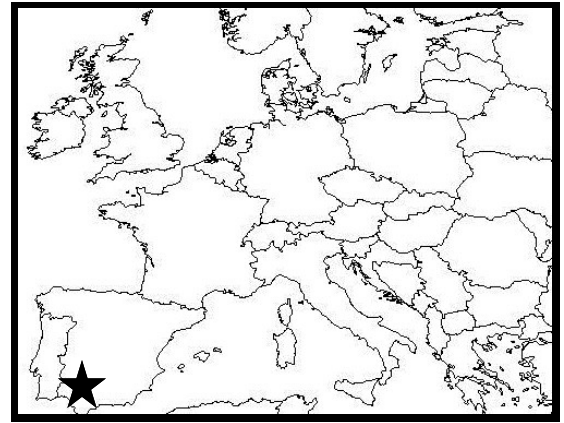

PROGRAM

International Studies Abroad (ISA) offers beginning, intermediate, and advanced level students the opportunity to study Spanish in Sevilla and take additional courses in English. The program includes a thorough orientation and very supportive on-site staff.

ACADEMICS

The Spanish Language, Culture, and Business in English program at Menedez Pelayo (UIMP) focuses on Spanish language with a few electives in English. Students at all levels are required to take Spanish language; other classes are offered in English or Spanish. You will take all your courses with other ISA students in the ISA Academic Center building. No Spanish students take classes at this location.

The Business and Liberal Arts program at Pablo de Olavide University (UPO) offers courses in Spanish at all levels as well as options in English. Fields of study include business, history, international studies, and Spanish culture and literature. Most classes are with U.S. and other international students, although superior level students may enroll in 2 classes with Spaniards. The UPO campus layout is similar to that of a U.S. university. Students will take public buses to and from the campus. An advantage of UPO is that Spaniards are taking courses in the same setting, unlike UIMP.

LOCATION: SEVILLA, SPAIN

Sevilla (700,000) is the largest city in southern Spain, and is the capital of Andalucía. Sevilla is home to flamenco and bullfighting, and known for its Cathedral, plazas, the Alcázar palace, and nightlife. Sevilla is a popular study abroad destination for U.S. students. The UIMP is centrally-located, while UPO is about five miles from the city center.

HOUSING & MEALS

Most students choose to live with host families carefully selected by ISA's resident staff. Living with a host family is an excellent way to become immersed in Spanish culture and improve your Spanish language skills. Meals are provided in the home stay setting. A limited number of apartments are available; no meals are included. You may not select independent housing. Meals on program excursions may be extra.

CULTURAL CONNECTIONS

The program excursions provide ample opportunity to explore Spain's wealth of architecture, culture heritage, music, and scenery. In addition, the on-site resident staff can help you identify other opportunities to interact with the local community, such as *intercambios* (conversation partners), flamenco dance lessons, and other extracurricular activities. Your host family will also be a great connection to the local culture. Consider participating in ISA's ELAP (volunteer) program—while this is offered at an additional cost not covered by the University of Denver, you may choose to apply for an ISA scholarship.

COST

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HOW TO APPLY

⇒ **Attend Study Abroad 101**

⇒ **Attend a Regional Advising Session**

⇒ **Meet with an international education advisor**

⇒ **Apply to study abroad!**

- Non-Cherrington students will be charged a \$50 application fee to their DU account.

Note: *Cherrington status may be revoked at any time due to a change in your student conduct or academic status. Also, the OIE will request your DU transcript; check and clear any holds now to avoid delays in processing your application!*

PROGRAM APPLICATION: DUE AFTER YOU'VE BEEN NOMINATED
