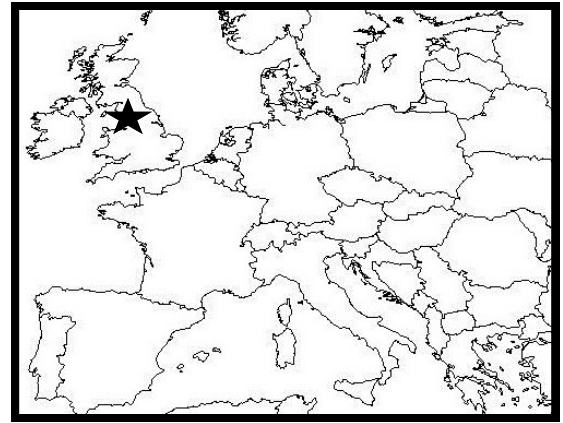

## PROGRAM

Bangor is a traditional university founded over 125 years ago, and is located in an area of outstanding natural beauty on the north west coast of Wales. The University currently has over 10,000 students, 1,400 of whom are international students from over 70 different countries. Around 200 students from the US, Canada, Europe, and Asia choose Bangor each year as their study abroad destination. The University also offers great support for its study abroad students, including assigned advisors, organized cultural events and peer guides. Here, you will be fully immersed, studying alongside local students with local professors. You will also participate in a week-long orientation before the start of classes.

## ACADEMICS

Students can take up to 6 courses across the University's 5 colleges: Arts, Education and Humanities; Business, Social Sciences and Law; Natural Sciences; Physical and Applied Sciences; and Health and Behavioral Sciences. The University's main campus is on a hill above the city, with its other 3 sites within easy walking distance of the main campus, city center and University accommodation. Students will be in class with local and other international students.

## LOCATION: BANGOR, WALES, UK

Situated where the mountains meet the sea, Bangor is one of the most attractive study locations in the UK, but yet one of the least expensive places to be a student in the UK. With a population of around 15,000 people, plus 10,000 students, Bangor is a true college town. It's referred to as the "Athens of Wales". It has a very developed transportation system that makes traveling within and outside the city simple, especially convenient considering Wales has more castles per square mile than any other country in Western Europe. Both Welsh and English are spoken in Bangor.

## HOUSING & MEALS

Accommodations are in University residence halls with local and international students. Students typically have a private bedroom with a bathroom and have access to a shared kitchen. If you're going for the cheapest housing option, then you not have a private bathroom, but will share one. Most of the residence halls are located on campus or within walking distance.

## CULTURAL CONNECTIONS

At the University, the [Students' Athletic Union](#) has around 45 different sports clubs and the [Students Union Clubs and Societies](#) has over 75 diverse societies that students can take advantage of. Students are encouraged to check out the many cultural opportunities throughout the city, from theater, to concerts, to museums, to the movies. The location also offers students a range of out-

# HOW TO APPLY

⇒ **Attend Study Abroad 101**

Held weekdays at the I-House. See website for schedule ([www.du.edu/intl/abroad/info\\_sessions.html](http://www.du.edu/intl/abroad/info_sessions.html)).

⇒ **Attend a Regional Advising Session**

Mandatory if you are considering the UK. See website for schedule (same link as above).

⇒ **Meet with an international education advisor.**

⇒ **Apply for a passport—<http://travel.state.gov/passport>**

If you already have one, make sure you know where it is and when it expires.

⇒ **Apply to study abroad!**

- Non-Cherrington students will be charged a \$50 application fee to their DU account.

**Note:** Cherrington status may be revoked at any time due to a change in your student conduct or academic status. Also, the OIE will request your DU transcript; check and clear any holds now to avoid delays in processing your application!
