Scholarship Opportunities:

New/Beginning Teachers: Canada in the Classroom Award (WWU - \$100-\$300)
Out-of-State Teachers: Regional Consulate General of Canada offices often provide travel awards (up to \$300 is applied for on behalf of all registrants from consular regions)
STUDY CANADA Travel Awards (WWU and UW offer travel rebates of \$100-\$300 when regional consulates do not have funding with a budget of \$1000)
Washington State Teachers: Canada-America Society (CAS) *Send-a-Teacher-to-Canada* Scholarship (\$300)
Consulate General of Canada, Seattle, Travel Award (TBD)

Registration Deadline: April 15, 2008 (rolling registration to a maximum of 25 people).

**A special grant from the Government of Canada subsidizes participant costs so that tuition/clock hours, Vancouver-Whistler RT transportation, accommodations, daily breakfasts, receptions and activity entry fees are included. Please note that transportation to/from Vancouver is not included.*

Program Fee: \$550 for in-state or out-of-state teachers payable with registration application.
Supplemental fees only—see below—are payable separately and due May 1, 2008.

Supplemental Fees: Single rooms are available but require a \$400 supplemental fee (50% room cost). Companions can join the group but a \$550 supplemental fee is charged for sharing a room, RT Vancouver-Whistler transportation, daily breakfasts and receptions. Activity fees are not included. All supplemental fees are due on/before **May 1, 2008**.

Accommodations: Signature Club rooms (Vancouver) and Deluxe rooms (Whistler) have 2D/Q beds and are assigned to 2 same-gendered participants unless a single room or companion supplement is paid.
