Drop off your I-20s for a Travel Signature

If you plan on traveling at the end of the quarter and need a new travel signature, you can drop it off at the I-House front desk. If you drop it off <u>before</u> 10 a.m., you will be able to pick it up at 4 p.m. the same day.

If you will be traveling outside the United States during Winter Break, make sure to refer to the ISSS <u>Travel Information</u> webpage before you depart the U.S. to ensure that you have all of the documentation required to re-enter the U.S. in student status. Be sure to check the date on your travel signature to be sure if it is still valid (they are valid for one year or the end of your I-20/DS-2019, whichever comes first). To help determine if you need a travel signature, you can use this chart as a guide.

We also are having a Travel Signature Clinic on November 14, 10am – 12pm and 1pm – 4pm
