Bio of Prof. Tun-Jen Cheng

Professor T. J. Cheng received B.A. from National Taiwan University, M.A. from University of Waterloo, Ontario and Ph.D. from University of California, Berkeley. He has previously taught at University of California, San Diego, and has been a visiting scholar at University of Tsukuba, Japan and an associate visiting professor at University of Michigan, Ann Arbor. His primary interests are in comparative political economy and East Asian development. He has published numerous journal articles and book chapters, co-authored *Newly Industrializing East Asia in Transition* and co-edited *Political Change in Taiwan, Inherited Rivalry, The Security Environment in the Asia-Pacific, New Leadership and New Agenda, Religious Organizations and Democracy in Contemporary Asia, and China Under Hu Jintao*. Professor Cheng was Editor-in-Chief of the *American Asian Review*, a major refereed quarterly on Asian affairs. He currently edits *Taiwan Journal of Democracy* and holds Class of 1935 Chair Professorship in the Government Department of the College of William and Mary.
