China's Emerging Generation of Leaders: Trajectory for the Future

Bio of Dr. Cheng Li



Cheng Li is a Senior Fellow at the Brookings Institution's John L. Thornton China Center in Washington, DC, and the William R. Kenan Professor of Government at Hamilton College in New York.

Dr. Li grew up in Shanghai during the Cultural Revolution. In 1985, he came to the United States where he received an M.A. in Asian Studies from the University of California, Berkeley, and a Ph.D. in Political Science from Princeton University. He is the author or the editor of *Rediscovering China: Dynamics and Dilemmas of Reform* (1997), *China's Leaders: The New Generation* (2001), *Bridging Minds Across the Pacific: The Sino-U.S. Educational Exchange 1978-2003* (2005), and *China's Changing Political Landscape: Prospects for Democracy* (2008). Dr. Li is also a columnist for the Stanford University journal, *China Leadership Monitor*.

Dr. Li has advised a wide range of U.S. government, education, research, business and not-for-profit organizations on work in China. Dr. Li is a director of the National Committee on U.S.-China Relations, a trustee of the Institute of Current World Affairs, a member of the Academic Advisory Group of the Congressional U.S.-China Working Group, and a member and a director of the Committee of 100. He has frequently been called upon to share his unique perspective and insights as an expert on China. He recently appeared on CNN, C-SPAN, BBC, News Hour with Jim Lehrer, Charlie Rose Show, Foreign Exchange with Fareed Zakaria, and NPR Diane Rehm Show.
