



Josef Korbel Scholarship Terms of Agreement

In accepting the Josef Korbel scholarship offered in my Josef Korbel School of International Studies acceptance letter, I understand the following:

- I understand that I must remain enrolled in a 90 credit hour Master's Program throughout my course of study at Josef Korbel School. If I switch to a dual degree program, a Peace Corps affiliated program (Fellows or Master's International) or a certificate program it will result in a forfeit of the remaining scholarship balance.
- I understand that I must maintain full-time student status (8 or more quarter credits). If I drop to half time (7 quarter credits or fewer), I recognize that I will forfeit the balance of the scholarship. I also understand that while on continuous enrollment, I am ineligible for the scholarship.
- I understand that scholarships are disbursed equally over three quarters (fall, winter, and spring) and that if I graduate early or do not register I will forfeit my disbursement for the quarter.
- I understand that my scholarship is contingent upon maintaining "satisfactory progress," which is equivalent to a 3.0/4.0 GPA and if my GPA drops below a 3.0, I am aware that the balance of the scholarship will be forfeited.

*** The following only applies to those applicants who submitted their application prior to completing their undergraduate degree:

- I understand that my offer of admission and scholarship are contingent upon successful completion of my undergraduate degree. I will provide the Josef Korbel School Office of Graduate Admissions with a final transcript to verify my final undergraduate GPA and the degree earned.
