

## DEGREES

In addition to offering six signature master's degrees, two mid-career degrees, degree programs for Peace Corps-affiliated students, and a selective PhD program, the Josef Korbel School also offers unique certificate programs and participates in dual degree programs with different schools and programs of the University of Denver. Master of Arts degrees typically take two academic years of full-time study to complete. Part-time study is also available and students have up to five years to complete a degree program.

The MA in Global Finance, Trade, and Economic Integration provides a multidisciplinary, policy-focused examination of the global economy. Courses focus on emerging patterns of financial, trade and human capital flows; the effect of globalization on state capacity, policy autonomy and national economic conditions; corporate governance and competition; and the interaction of interest groups, states and multilateral agreements and organizations.

The MA in International Administration provides insight into the human dimension of organizational life; students study public finance and the policy-making process; acquire specific skills associated with managing nonprofit and public sector organizations; and develop their understanding of international affairs. The overall goal is to establish a foundation of management skills required to become a leader in a nonprofit or public sector organization in an international context.

The MA in International Development focuses on development theory, policy analysis, politics of institutions and relevant research and management skills. The program also emphasizes sustainable economic and human development, human rights, distributive justice and environmental sustainability. Students explore the diversity of needs, desires, opportunities, and constraints that are experienced by individuals of differing socioeconomic classes, ethnicities and genders, as well as differences among nations and regions.

The MA in International Human Rights explores issues of human dignity and critically examines the norms, processes and institutions designed to promote and protect human rights. Human rights are examined as they relate to development, health, security and humanitarian assistance. For practical experience, students are offered skills courses, internships and opportunities for field work in the U.S. and around the world.

The MA in International Security views security from a broad theoretical and historical perspective, placing traditional security concerns in the context of such fields as development, economics and human rights. Students focus on topics that include strategy, foreign policy, intelligence, homeland security, military analysis, regional security and conflict resolution.

The MA in International Studies combines an interdisciplinary core with an in-depth study of a disciplinary field and a substantive concentration. Students obtain a broad exposure to the intellectual fields of international studies and the theoretical traditions scholars have used to study our complex world.

In cooperation with the U.S. Peace Corps, the Josef Korbel School offers the Master's International Program and Fellows Program. #### DEGREES (continued)

The Master of Arts in Homeland Security is designed for mid-career professionals with at least seven years of related professional work experience. The degree allows students to pursue their studies in greater depth in an updated format designed to address contemporary policy issues and global problems.

The Master of Global Studies is designed for junior diplomats, military officers and other mid-career professionals with more than five years of relevant work experience. In close consultation with a faculty advisor, each student designs a personalized program that will focus on one or two fields, concentrations, or issue specializations.

The Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) in International Studies provides advanced, interdisciplinary study of international politics, comparative politics, international political economy and/or political theory—with ample opportunities for customization, creativity and exploration. The program requires coursework, written and oral comprehensive examinations, and successful completion and defense of a dissertation.

#### CERTIFICATES

Certificates may be combined with a Josef Korbel School of International Studies degree program. Both homeland security certificates and the global health affairs certificate are awarded as stand-alone certificates.

The Certificate in Global Health Affairs provides advanced theoretical, practical and leadership training at the intersection of health and international affairs. The program emphasizes in-depth training in global health governance, policy and planning and entrepreneurship, and includes numerous practice opportunities.

The Certificate in Homeland Security is for graduate students interested in preparing for careers in the field of homeland security. In addition to the challenges of terrorism, students examine the broader issues of all-hazards disasters and their consequences from the perspectives of local, state, federal and the international public and private sectors.

The Professional Homeland Security Certificate is for homeland security professionals. Developed in partnership with the Naval Post Graduate School and the National Guard Bureau, this year-long program allows students to improve scholarship, strategic thinking and professional networking through the study of terrorism, all-hazards disasters and current local, state, national, and private sector efforts in homeland security organization and planning.

The Certificate in Humanitarian Assistance provides a deep understanding of the theoretical, normative and practical dimensions of humanitarian intervention and disaster relief. Students are equipped to understand the nature of complex emergencies, global contexts of crisis, principles of humanitarian intervention and the structure and function of international organizations that deliver such assistance. The program places strong emphasis on substantive field-based training, including participation in an internship.

**WINTER ENROLLMENT:** October 15th (September 15th for international applicants)

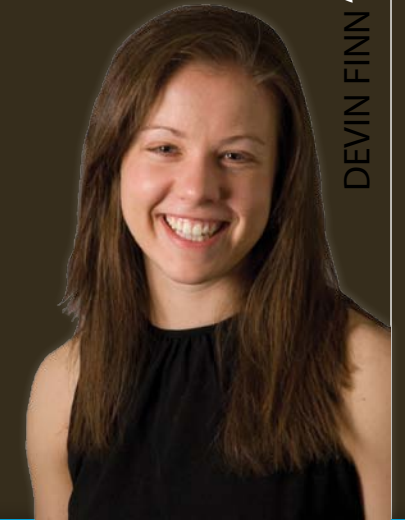
