Established on April 4, 2014 thanks to a gift from Craig R. Harrison, Nicole A. Harrison, Craig D. Harrison and Carol A. Harrison, matched by the University of Denver's scholarship funds, the Casey Scholarship is awarded annually to graduate students who have served in the United States Armed Forces who exhibit exemplary leadership qualities and who have been accepted to pursue a graduate degree at the Josef Korbel School.

Scholarship applications are personally reviewed by General Casey. Awards are made by the Korbel School's director of graduate admissions on the basis of academic merit, demonstrated financial need and a review of their military service.

General Casey received his MA in International Relations from the Josef Korbel School in 1980. His distinguished career in the United States Army spanned four decades. General Casey served as the 36th Chief of Staff of the United States Army (2007–2011) and, among other positions, was Commander of the Multi-National Force in Iraq (2004–2007), where he oversaw a coalition of more than 30 countries. A strong advocate of the importance of effective communications between the military and civilians within the government, particularly during wartime, General Casey began teaching a graduate-level course on civil-military relations at the Korbel School in 2012.
