A majority of University of Denver students receive financial assistance, and for talented musicians that assistance can make this unique education surprisingly affordable. Music scholarships range from one thousand dollars, to full-tuition, and are awarded based on outstanding auditions and interviews.

UNDERGRADUATE FULL-TUITION MUSIC SCHOLARSHIPS

The following Music scholarships are each four year, full-tuition scholarships that are offered every year. Each successful auditionee will perform literature from the Undergraduate Audition Requirements list at an extremely high technical and musical level. The descriptions and qualifications are applicable for students entering the 1997-98 academic year.

Clarinet: The recipient of this award will demonstrate leadership in performance and professionalism in the Lamont Wind Ensemble, Lamont Symphony Orchestra and various chamber groups.

Horn: The recipient of this award will demonstrate leadership in performance and professionalism in the Lamont Wind Ensemble, Lamont Symphony Orchestra and various chamber groups.

Drum Set: The recipient of this award will demonstrate leadership in performance and professionalism in the Lamont Jazz Orchestra, Lamont Wind Ensemble and various chamber jazz groups.

Violin: The recipient of this award will demonstrate leadership in performance and professionalism in the Lamont Symphony Orchestra and various chamber groups.

Piano: The recipient of this award will demonstrate leadership in performance and professionalism in solo performance and active accompanying of other student performers.

Tenor: The recipient of this award will demonstrate leadership in performance and professionalism in solo performance and the Lamont Opera Theater.

ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIPS

The following endowed scholarships are each four year, full-tuition scholarships that are offered to one student at a time. Particular scholarships may not be available the year you audition.

Jack and Ethel Bernstone Scholarship

The Jack and Ethel Bernstone Scholarship is awarded to the outstanding auditionee in the area of strings the year the scholarship is available.

Helen Thompson Heath Scholarship

The Helen Thompson Heath Scholarship is awarded to the outstanding auditionee in the area of voice the year the scholarship is available.

Lenore Green-Ott Scholarship

The Helen Thompson Heath Scholarship is awarded to the outstanding overall auditionee the year the scholarship is available.

UNDERGRADUATE PARTIAL TUITION MUSIC SCHOLARSHIPS

Many students receive partial tuition waiver through music scholarships. These scholarships are available to all instruments and vocal ranges.

GRADUATE DEAN'S SCHOLARSHIPS

Graduate Dean's Scholarships are offered by the Director of the Lamont School of Music to exceptionally talented graduate students. These awards are in the form of tuition waivers and are not restricted to instrument or vocal range. Graduate Dean's Scholarships can be as high as full-tuition.

GRADUATE TEACHING ASSISTANTSHIPS

Graduate Teaching Assistantships are tuition waivers up to full-tuition plus a stipend, and can be renewed for a second year. Availability of Assistantships varies in relation to current appointments. Job descriptions and responsibilities also vary, contact the department chairperson or director listed next to the area for more information.

SCHOLARSHIP REQUIREMENTS

All students applying for scholarships must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). This application must be submitted as soon as possible after January first of each year and prior to February twentieth to insure priority in scholarship and financial aid awards. You may obtain a FAFSA from your guidance counselor, financial aid office, or request one from the University of Denver Office of Financial Aid at (303) 871-XXXX.

All scholarship, assistantship, grant, and loan notifications are made after the processing of the FAFSA and acceptance into the University of Denver.

APPLYING FOR MUSIC SCHOLARSHIPS AND ASSISTANTSHIPS

All music scholarships and assistantships are awarded based on the quality of auditions and interviews. To audition for a music scholarship you need only complete the Application for Admission and Audition Reservation form and return it to:
