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Responsible Conduct of Research – NIH, NSF

Effective January 2010 NSF Requirements

PIs submitting applications to NSF will need to complete an institutional program of education in the Responsible Conduct of Research (RCR).

In order to fulfill the minimum requirement ORSP will require successful completion of selected modules of the on-line RCR program hosted by the Collaborative Institutional Training Initiative (CITI); for more information please visit the Research Compliance website.

Post Approval Monitoring

A Human Research Subject Post Monitoring Program will be in place this year. The purpose of this program is to assess research activities. This program assures human subject protections, provides education to researchers, and identifies

The following applies to all NIH Training grants, Individual Fellowship Awards, Career Development, Research Education grants, Dissertation Research grants or other programs with a training component.

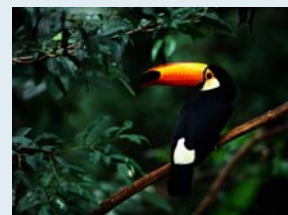
