### Online Application Submissions

In the past year, the Office of Sponsored Programs evaluated and planned considerable upgrades to the Institutional Committees application submission process.

These Committees include the Institutional Review Board for the Protection of Human Subjects (IRB), Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee (IACUC), and the Institutional Biosafety Committee (IBC).

The new electronic system will provide web-based functionality servicing DU's research community and Committee Members.

In addition, implementation of a web-based system is expected to allow continuous improvements of oversight processes not previously possible with a paper-based IRB review mechanism.
