

Mr. Stone has been practicing social work in Denver since receiving his MSW from Colorado State University in 1991. He has worked with folks who were homeless at Stout Street Clinic and with people living with HIV and AIDS, and their families, through Denver Health and Hospitals. For a number of years Mr. Stone also saw adult clients in his private practice. Since 1997 working with youth and families has been his primary focus. Mr. Stone has worked with youth and families in residential, outpatient and juvenile justice contexts and currently works as a child and family therapist at Aurora Mental Health Center. He also founded, and is Executive Director of, a non-profit called Banyan Tree which uses multi-cultural arts, especially hand-drumming, and therapeutic services to strengthen individuals, families and neighborhoods in northeast Denver. Banyan Tree is relocating to the Aurora Human Rights Center in Original Aurora. From 1995 to 2000 Mr. Stone trained at The Colorado Center for Psychoanalytic Studies.
