

A Guide to the APR

The Academic Progress Report (APR) is a planning document that provides a quarterly record of your progress toward fulfilling your degree requirements, as well as your grade point average (GPA). Your APR provides a synopsis of your completion of major and minor requirements, degree requirements, and electives. You may access and print your APR via the myWeb tab in webCentral to use in quarterly advising sessions with your advisers. As a First-Year student, you will receive advising from your FSEM mentor. Keep in mind that while the APR is useful, it is not a substitute for an appointment with your adviser.

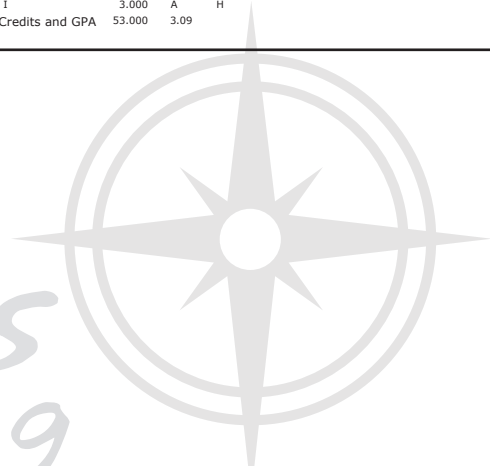

How can I print my APR?

- Go to <http://www.du.edu/>
- Click on "Current Students" on the right side of the page
- Click on "WebCentral"
- Login to WebCentral with your DUID and passcode
- Click on the Student tab at the top of the page
- Click on "Academic Progress Report (APR)"
- Select the current term, then click "Submit"
- Click on your degree as shown
- Choose "General" or "Detailed Requirements," then click "Submit"
