



Additional Services Provided by The Office of Academic Advising

What do we do to assist students?

- Work developmentally with students in academic distress or difficulty, including all students on Academic Warning (2.0-2.1 cumulative GPA), Academic Probation (2.0 or below), or in Precipitous Decline (a single quarter GPA below 1.0)
- Assist students who need to take a voluntary or medical leave of absence from the university with their departure and re-entry
- Advise students who are undeclared, undecided, or who want to change majors
- Approve overload requests for students requesting to take more than 19 credits in one quarter
- Advise and oversee the process for student who seek exceptions to academic policy via the Committee for Academic Exceptions
- Approve requests for study abroad courses to count for University Requirements
- Provide training and support for faculty advising
- Advising and counsel students or connect them with appropriate resources on a variety of issues including but not limited to:
 - Financial difficulties
 - Emotional issues
 - Diversity and inclusive excellence challenges in academics
 - International student transition or adjustment
 - Difficulty with learning styles or disabilities
 - Lack of motivation
 - Relationship or family issues
 - Confusion related to the advising process
 - Planning for graduate school
 - Time management
 - Study skills
 - Test anxiety
