

## Academic Advising Guide Common Curriculum

*For students who matriculated in fall 2010 and beyond*

Common Curriculum	Details for completing requirements.
<b>First-Year Seminar</b>	<b>4 credit hours</b>
<b>First Year Writing &amp; Rhetoric</b>	<b>8 credit hours</b> WRIT 1122 and 1133 (found under Writing) OR with AP/IB or permission from the instructor WRIT 1622 and WRIT 1633 OR Honors WRIT 1622 & WRIT 1733
<b>Foreign Language (FOLA)</b>	<b>4-12 credit hours</b> in the same language (i.e., Italian 1001, 1002, 1003) <i>Students need one year of proficiency in a language and at least one college-level course demonstrating <b>Proficiency Plus</b>:</i> <i>Completing one year of college-level courses in the same language ( i.e., Italian 1001, 1002, 1003)</i> <b>OR</b> through AB/IP or a Placement Exam they place into Italian 2001 or higher (they have met the first year proficiency and now need to meet the Plus one college-level course). <i>Students will complete the 2001 course to meet the FOLA requirement.</i>  <i>Incoming INTS majors who successfully test out of two years of a foreign language through the DU placement exam, will still be required to take one college level course to meet the Proficiency Plus requirement. Students will know which upper level course to take as noted on their placement exam form. Or students may complete the first two years of a new language</i>
<b>Analytical Inquiry-Natural</b>	<b>4 credit hours</b> Check with your Major Adviser to determine which Analytical Inquiry-Natural course(s) are options for your major. <b>Analytical Inquiry-Society</b>	<b>8 credit hours (two from different disciplines)</b> Approved courses for this requirement can be found at <a href="http://du.edu/commoncurriculum">du.edu/commoncurriculum</a> Courses include History, Theatre, Philosophy, Art/Art History, Music, Culture, English, Religious Studies, Languages and Literatures, Judaic Studies, Anthropology, Digital Media Studies, MFJS (Media, Journalism and Film Studies) and Geography. <i>Students may find these courses listed by subject. Courses can be searched by the Analytical Inquiry-Society attribute.</i>
<b>Scientific Inquiry-Natural</b>	<b>12 hours in the same sequence</b> All three courses have to be taken in the same subject Courses include Biology, Chemistry, Engineering, Geography, Physics, All three courses have to be taken in the same subject <i>Students may find these courses listed by subject. Courses can be searched by the Scientific Inquiry-Natural attribute</i>
<b>Scientific Inquiry-Society</b>	<b>8 credit hours (two from different disciplines)</b> Approved courses for this requirement can be found at <a href="http://du.edu/commoncurriculum">du.edu/commoncurriculum</a> Courses include Sociology, Geography, Psychology, Public Policy, Political Science, Anthropology, Gender and Women’s Studies, Economics, Communication Studies, MFJS (Media, Journalism and Film Studies), and Digital Media Studies <i>Students may find these courses listed by subject. Courses can be searched by the Scientific Inquiry-Society attribute.</i>
<b>Advanced Seminar (ASEM)</b>	<b>4 credit hours</b> Approved courses for this requirement can be found under the Advanced Seminar category. <b>Students CANNOT “check off” an ASEM course for both a Major Requirement and Common Curriculum</b>
