

Application Procedures

The Learning Effectiveness Program application process is separate from the University of Denver admission process. We encourage prospective students to begin both processes at the same time. However, students must be admitted to the University of Denver before they can enroll in the Learning Effectiveness Program.

LEP

The Learning Effectiveness Program is a fee-for-service program offering comprehensive, individualized support to University of Denver students with Learning Disabilities and/or ADHD.



The LEP provides a variety of services designed to support each student's academic experience. Our philosophy emphasizes student responsibility, self-awareness, and self-advocacy. The services offered by the LEP are designed to support academic success.

LEP Academic Counselors

Each LEP student is assigned to an academic counselor. Counselors provide services designed to meet each student's individualized needs. Meetings are student-directed and include:

- Academic support
- Writing development
- Time management guidance

LEP academic counselors have experience working both with university systems and students with LD/ADHD. Counselors have expertise in several academic disciplines.

Subject Tutors

Discipline-specific tutors (for example: business, English, math, and science) are available to LEP students. The LEP tutoring program is on-site, with tutors scheduled to be available throughout the day and into the evening hours. Many LEP tutors are DU graduate students. The tutorial services are included in the LEP fees.

Academic Advising

The staff of the LEP strongly encourages LEP students to consult with their faculty mentors/faculty advisors. LEP students meet with their academic counselors to discuss academic considerations related to their LD/ADHD.



Other Services

In addition to academic counseling and tutoring, the LEP offers a variety of services, including the following:

- LEP Writing Development Program offers students an in-depth focus on writing skills
- Access to an organizational expert for assistance in time management and organizational skill development
- BELAY, a DU student organization for students interested in disabilities, advocacy, and fun
- Computer lab with internet access

Accommodations

The Disability Services Program provides qualified students with appropriate accommodations such as, but not limited to, extended time testing, early registration, foreign language substitution, and access to alternative formats. LEP counselors coach students on accessing the accommodation request process through the Disability Services Program.
