Furthermore, each non-piano major is required to take a piano proficiency placement test during orientation week. If you have little to no experience, you will likely be placed in Piano Class I (MTWR, 8-9:00am or 12-1:00pm). Another class that most first-year students take is Music Technology. You only need to take it once and it will be offered MTWR, 9-10:00am or 1-2:00pm in the Autumn quarter, or 1-2:00pm in the Spring quarter. † **A Note on Labs:** Some courses require lab sessions, in addition to the lectures scheduled above. In scheduling a First-Year Seminar, you do not need to be aware of lab times, as there will be several from which to choose. You should have no problems finding a lab that best fits your schedule when you register for your Fall courses during Discoveries—just be sure not to take a First-Year Seminar during a required course's scheduled lecture as noted above (remember, these courses ONLY apply if they are listed for your major).
