BIOGRAPHIES OF PRIMARY INVESTIGATORS

ANDREW GOETZ

Dr. Andrew R. Goetz is an Associate Professor of Geography and Associate Director in the Intermodal Transportation Institute at the University of Denver. Professor Goetz conducts research and teaches courses in transportation planning, surface passenger transportation, air passenger transportation, intermodal transportation, urban and regional planning, and land use planning, among others. He has co-authored two books, one about Denver International Airport (with Paul Dempsey and Joseph Szyliowicz) and another on airline deregulation (with Paul Dempsey), as well as numerous journal articles on topics in transportation, urban studies, and economic geography. He is on the editorial board of the *Journal of Transport Geography* and has served as chairman of the Transportation Specialty Group of the Association of American Geographers. Professor Goetz was designated as project leader for this Metropolitan Planning Organization Study.

PAUL STEPHEN DEMPSEY

Dr. Paul Stephen Dempsey is Professor of Law and Director of the Transportation Law Program at the University of Denver. He is Director of the National Center for Intermodal Transportation. Dr. Dempsey is also Vice Chairman and Director of Frontier Airlines, Inc. He formerly served as an attorney with the Interstate Commerce Commission, and the U.S. Civil Aeronautics Board. The author of 10 books and more than 50 scholarly articles, Dr. Dempsey holds the following degrees: Bachelor of Arts (1972) and Juris Doctor (1975), University of Georgia; Master of Laws (1978) George Washington University; Doctor of Civil Laws (1987) Institute of Air & Space Law, McGill University. He is admitted to practice law in Colorado, Georgia and the District of Columbia.

CARL LARSON

Dr. Carl Larson is Professor of Human Communication Studies and past Dean of Social Sciences at the University of Denver. He earned his B.A. degree (1961) in Speech and Drama at Idaho State University and both his M.A. degree (1962) and Ph.D. (1965) in Communication at the University of Kansas. Larson's main research activities have focused on groups and teams, and on negotiation and collaborative processes. He has co-authored seven books on communication, including *Teamwork: What Must Go Right/What Can Go Wrong*, with Frank LaFasto (Newbury Park, Calif. Sage 1989) and *Successful communication and Negotiation*, with Alvin Goldberg (Gardena, Calif. International Right of Way Association, 1992). His newest book, *Collaborative leadership* (with David Chrislip) published by Jossey-Bass in 1994, reports research on successful collaborative projects and their leadership. Larson does extensive consulting with both private and public sector organizations on teamwork and collaboration. In 1997 Larson received the Driscoll Master Education Award, given by the students of Denver University to the outstanding professor of the year.
