**TRANSPORTATION AND SECURITY TOPICS AT SPRING BOARD MEETING OF
INTERMODAL TRANSPORTATION INSTITUTE AT THE UNIVERSITY OF DENVER
MEETING IN WASHINGTON, D.C.**

DENVER, CO, May 2, 2006 – The Intermodal Transportation Institute (ITI) at the University of Denver held its spring Board of Directors meeting in Washington, D.C., April 26-27 with the theme of “Transportation and Security.” Guest speakers included Kip Hawley, Assistant Secretary, Transportation Security Administration (TSA), Department Homeland Security (DHS), and John Horsley, Executive Director, American Association of State Highway and Transportations Officials (AASHTO).

Tom Finkbiner, ITI Board chairman, said the meeting was extremely productive and valuable. “Our nation’s transportation infrastructure and its security, including railroads, ports, trucking and airlines, are topics high on the nation’s agenda,” he said. “This meeting produced some thought-provoking ideas on how to help address the problems and opportunities facing the country’s complex transportation systems and its security concerns.”
