Feminist Engagements with Rhetoric: The Possibilities

Cheryl Glenn is Professor of English and Women's Studies and Co-Director of the Center for Democratic Deliberation, at Penn State University. She is currently Associate Chair of the 7000-member Conference on College Composition and Communication, becoming chair next year. Glenn is author of five important books—including *Unspoken: A Rhetoric of Silence* and *Rhetoric Retold: Regendering the Tradition from Antiquity Through the Renaissance* (both Southern Illinois); *Rhetorical Education in America* (Alabama), and *The St. Martin's Guide to Teaching Writing*—as well as editor of two others. With a Ph.D., M.A., B.S. from Ohio State University, Glenn's research interests include rhetorical histories and theories; composition theory and practice; and feminist and gender theories. Among her many awards are the College of Liberal Arts Outstanding Teaching Award (Penn State), The Elizabeth P. Ritchie Distinguished Professor Award (Oregon State), the CCCC Richard Braddock Award, and the *Rhetoric Review* Outstanding Article. In addition to her current leadership in CCCC, Glenn has served as President of the Coalition of Women of Women Scholars in the History of Rhetoric and Composition; Member of the *PMLA* Advisory Committee; Chair, MLA Division on the History and Theory of Rhetoric and Composition; and member of the Editorial Board or Consulting Reader for nine prominent journals.
