Mike Palmquist is Professor of English and University Distinguished Teaching Scholar at Colorado State University, where he directs the University's Institute for Learning and Teaching and co-directs the Center for Research on Writing and Communication Technologies. His scholarly interests include writing across the curriculum, the effects of network technologies on writing, and new approaches to scholarly publishing.

Among Palmquist's books are *The Bedford Researcher* (Bedford/St. Martin's, 2002, 2005) and *Designing Writing* (Bedford/St. Martin's, 2005). He is co-author of *Transitions: Teaching Writing in Computer-Supported and Traditional Classrooms*, (Ablex, 1998) and *Writing with a Computer*, (Allyn and Bacon, 1999). His essays have appeared in *Computers and Composition*, *Written Communication*, *Kairos*, and in edited collections. He is the developer of Writing@CSU, the University's Online Writing Center, is founding editor of *Academic Writing*, and edits the *WAC Clearinghouse*, a major online resource.
