Victor Villanueva has won two national awards for *Bootstraps: From an American Academic of Color*, written nearly 40 articles, and delivered over 35 keynote and featured addresses.

A Brooklyn-born Puerto Rican high school dropout, Villanueva entered community college after the military and eventually went on to receive his PhD in English from the University of Washington. At Washington State University, he has worked as an Equal Opportunity Program Director, Director of Composition, and English Department Chair. He is a former chair of the Conference on College Composition and Communications.

Villanueva's research concerns the interconnectedness among rhetoric, ideology, racism, and literacy practices.
