The fourth annual Fred Marcus Memorial Holocaust Lecture will take place on Sunday, April 9, 2006 at Temple Sinai. The speakers will be Rena Krasno and Audrey Friedman Marcus, authors of a forthcoming book based on the Shanghai diaries of Fred Marcus. They will read extracts from the diary and provide personal and historical commentaries. Rena Krasno, who translated the diaries from German, was born in Shanghai. She is well-known on the lecture circuit and for her many books, including her memoir *Strangers Always: A Jewish Family in Wartime Shanghai*. Audrey Friedman Marcus was the co-founder of A.R.E. Publishing, Inc. and has written and edited many books for teachers and students in Jewish schools.
