“Kindertransport” (German for “Children transport”) is an important part of Holocaust history; it refers to a rescue mission that saved nearly 10,000 children, most of them Jewish, who found refuge in England in the months following *Kristallnacht* (Nov. 9-10, 1938). The majority never saw their parents again.

Kindertransport, written by Diane Samuels and produced by Theatre Or and MACC, is the poignant story of a child of the transport who wants to bury her past, and her relationship with her daughter, who needs to understand her mother’s story in order to forge her own identity.
