

Cognitive Neuroscience Specialization, Psychology BS Requirements

- The BS in Psychology requires all University BS degree requirements (see Bulletin)
 - Psychology major and **Cognitive Neuroscience Biological Sciences major or minor** (see **Biological Sciences adviser for requirements**) **plus one additional minor**
 - MATC 1200 is recommended for students with appropriate background, but is not required
- **A minimum of 45 hours** of courses with prefix PSYC
- At least 25 PSYC upper division hours (2000 and above)
- Minimum GPA of 2.0 overall AND in the major
- For a PSYC course to count towards a requirement and minimum hours, you must earn a C- or above
- INFO 1020/STAT 1300 or BIOL 2090 satisfies the Statistics requirement but the hours do not count towards the major
