Throughout her career, Elaine Welteroth has continuously broken new ground. Her promotion to editor-in-chief at *Teen Vogue* at age 29 made her the youngest in Conde Nast's 107-year history to become an editor, and the second African-American to hold the title in the company's history. Under her leadership, *Teen Vogue* notably increased coverage of news and politics, encouraging readers to become civically engaged, specifically during the 2016 US presidential election. Since leaving *Teen Vogue* in 2018, she continued to forge her own path, including writing for the hit show *Grown-ish*, appearing on-camera for various media outlets including ABC News and Netflix, and publishing her first book, *More than Enough* (to be released in June 2019). Never one to back down from the unknown, Elaine has become a leading expert, advocate, and voice for the next generation of change-makers.

We are so pleased that Elaine will join us for an intimate conversation at this year's HerDU on March 8.
