College Board will provide universities and colleges AP scores on the normal 1-5 scale, and DU will award credit based on our standard policies. Students must take the exams to receive credit from DU.

IB

International Baccalaureate will provide universities and colleges IB scores at each subject level on the normal IB 1-7 scale, and DU will award credit based on our standard policies.

Transfer credit for Pass/Fail grades on official college transcripts

Courses showing a grade of "P" (Pass) on an official college transcript are, and will continue to be, transferred in for credit as long as the course is similar to one taught at DU, and the issuing institution indicates that "P" (Pass) equals "C-" (1.7) or better performance. Transfer grades are not included in a student's DU GPA.

DU recognizes that some institutions converted courses that would normally be awarded letter grades to P/F (Pass/Fail) for all students in the Spring 2020 and Summer 2020 terms.

Temporary addendum to DU policy: courses with a final official "P" grade that equals "C-" (1.7) or better taken Spring 2020 and/or Summer 2020 terms will be eligible to be transferred in for DU Common Curriculum or specific degree plan requirements. This temporary change in policy applies to classes taken these two terms only; whereas typically, courses receiving "P" (equal to C- or better) can only be transferred in as elective credit.
