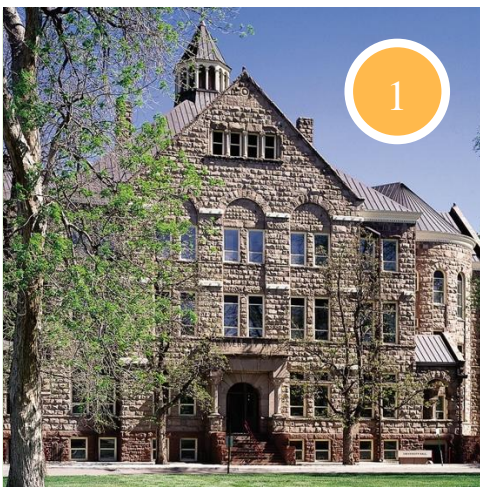


## Self–Guided Tour (with Fun Facts!)

Stop 1:

## University Hall

Nothing comes for free, including your college education. The Financial Aid Office helps you with your financial package and finding scholarships. Every penny counts!

## Fun Fact:

University Hall was the first building constructed on this site of the DU campus. The university was originally located in Downtown Denver.

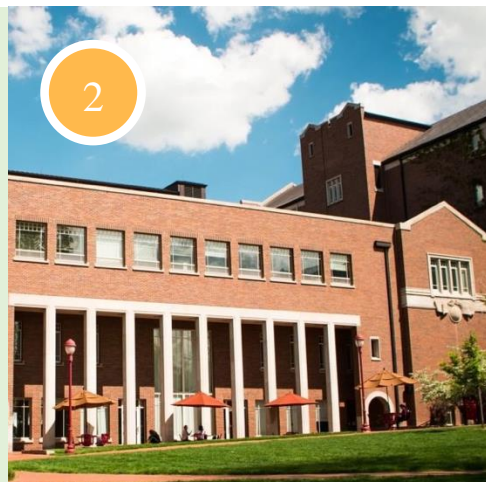
Stop 2:

## Daniels College of Business

Daniels is Colorado's highest ranked undergraduate business program, ranked number 56 in the nation – Bloomberg Businessweek (2016).

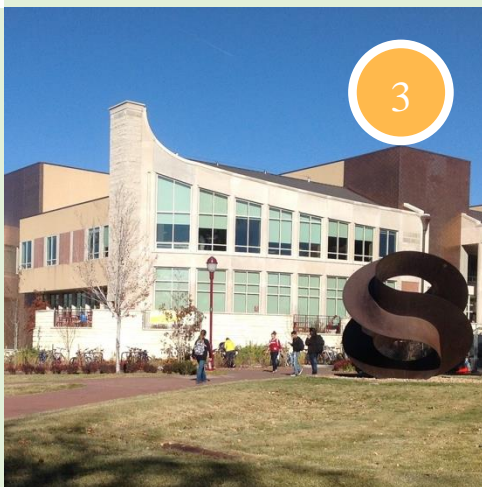
## Fun Fact:

The Daniels College of Business was constructed using Old World Construction, meaning the building is built to stand for over 300 years and can be completely gutted and redesigned inside.



## Fun Fact:

The Anderson Academic Commons is formerly known as the Penrose Library. The building was completely renovated in 2013. Now tons of steel from the Penrose Building now serve as shelving in the library.



Stop 3:

## Anderson Academic Commons

This building is our beautiful library. Everything from help with research to tutoring and writing assistance can be obtained here.

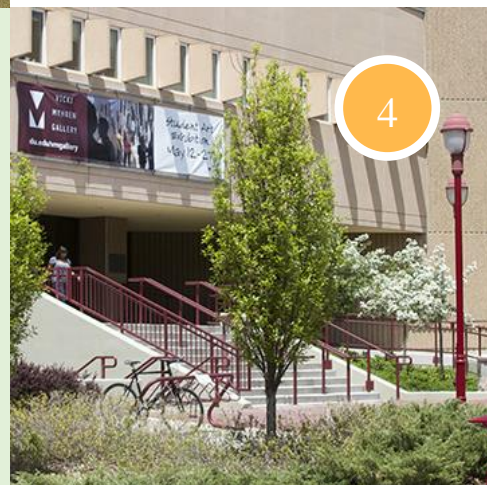
Stop 4:

## Shwayder Art Building

Sculpture, painting, photography, printmaking; Shwayder has it all. Each quarter a new exhibition opens in the Vicki Myhren Gallery.

The lips along the sidewalk are modeled after professors' lips and various lectures have been recorded to play as people walk by the lips. It is a DU tradition for students to kiss the lips for good luck on final exams.





Stop 5:

## Ritchie Center

Play a game of racquetball in the Coors Fitness Center or attend a hockey game in Magness Arena. This building also houses our Health and Counseling Center.



## Fun Fact:

Inside the Daniel L. Ritchie Center for Health and Wellness, the El Pomar Natatorium is home to the monumental tile mosaic *Ocean Mosaic Scene*. The mural was created by DU professor Maynard Tischler.



Stop 6:

## Sturm Hall

Here is where most of your Common Curriculum classes will be held (not to be confused with our Sturm College of Law across Driscoll Green).

## Fun Fact:

Home of the University of Denver Museum of Anthropology – a teaching museum dedicated to educating students about the ethical practices of conservation, interpretation, and administration of anthropological collections. The gallery is free and open to the public.

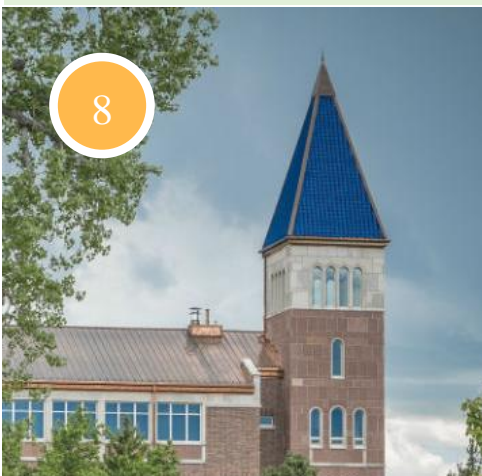
## Fun Fact:
