



Voluntary Medication Recall

The University of Denver Health and Counseling Center has been notified of a voluntary recall of medication you may be taking. The oral contraceptive pill packets containing Drospirenone/Ethinyl Estradiol 3 MG/0.03 MG tablets may contain incorrect tablet arrangements and/or empty blister pockets. As a result of this packaging error tablets may be missing or inactive pills switched for active pills. This can put you at risk of pregnancy. To date, no cases of pregnancy or adverse events have been reported.

Your pharmacy should contact you regarding this recall but if you have received impacted lots of Drospirenone/Ethinyl Estradiol Tablets, 3MG/0.03MG or have questions regarding this recall please contact your pharmacy. Per the manufacturer, if you received one of the impacted packages, keep taking your prescription but use a non-hormonal method of birth control (ie. condoms) as back up until you are able to replace your medication. Return the impacted packages to your pharmacy and the pharmacy will replace the packages with an unaffected medication when possible. When not possible, the pharmacy will contact your medical provider for a new prescription. The following can identify the NDC and Lot numbers involved in the recall:
