| Destiny Capital Corporation Internship Fund | Funding for a GFTEI student to pursue unpaid internship domestic or abroad or an internship with insufficient compensation that would not allow the student to accept the internship. Contact iscrc@du.edu or 303.871.4490 for more information. |

| <u>Institute for Humane Studies-- Hayek Fund for Scholars</u> | Graduate students intending to pursue academic careers and untenured faculty members whose academic work contributes to the understanding of the principles, practices, and institutions necessary to a free society or to the understanding of the classical liberal or libertarian tradition. Up to \$1,000 for career-advancing activities with year-round, rolling applications. |
| <u>Fulbright Program for Foreign Students</u> | Programs and funding varies by country, see website. |
| <u>US Institute of Peace Priority Grant Competition</u> | Funding for non-profit organizations and individuals involved in activities that enhance the mechanisms for advancing knowledge and practice of conflict prevention and peacebuilding in Afghanistan, Iran, Iraq, Pakistan and Sudan. Amount based on proposed budget, applications accepted year round. |
| <u>Margart McNamara Memorial Fund</u> | Funding for women students from developing countries who are currently studying in the US or Canada, whose graduate studies and future plans aim to benefit women and children in their respective regions |
| <u>APSA Fund for Latino Scholarship</u> | Funding for individual Latino(a) students who are participating in political science-related programs and activities. Provides support for travel and institutional proposals for student recruitment and retention. |
| <u>The Barakat Trust Grant</u> | Funding for graduate Muslim scholars who are administering research trips, projects, documentation, education programmes, exhibitions and publications. |

| <u>OAS Professional Development Scholarship</u> | Citizens or permanent residents of OAS member states who are undertaking professional development courses aimed to expand or refresh participants' professional expertise in areas of specialization related to the priority development areas of the OAS as outlined in the Inter-American Council for Integral Development. |
| <u>German Academic Exchange Service--DAAD</u> | Various grants for study and/or research |
| <u>International Fellowship for Prospective Leaders--German Chancellor Fellowship</u> | Awarded to young professionals in private, public, non-profit, cultural and academic sectors. Includes 1 year stay in Germany for study, research or professional development with 2-3,000 euro monthly stipend and allowances. |
| Environment Fellowship | Funding for research concerning environmental public policy or environmental conflict resolution. Contact Jane Curlin at curlin@udall.gov for more information. |
| <u>Fulbright US Scholar Programs</u> | The core Fulbright Scholar Program sends 800 U.S. faculty and professionals abroad each year. Grantees lecture and conduct research in a wide variety of academic and professional fields. |

| <u>John Simon Guggenheim Memorial Foundation Fellowship</u> | Often characterized as "midcareer" awards, Guggenheim Fellowships are intended for men and women who have already demonstrated exceptional capacity for productive scholarship or exceptional creative ability in the arts. |
