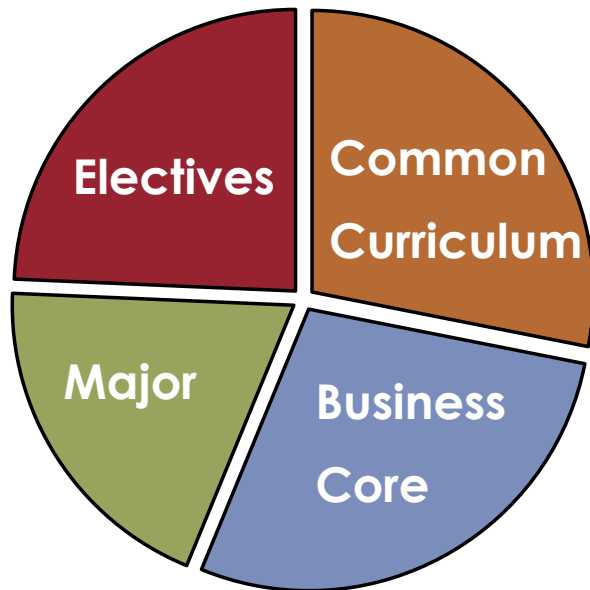

# Scheduling Courses for Fall 2020



- 4 Classes (x4 Credit Hours) =  
16 Credits Per Quarter
- All first-year students (*i.e., those new to college*) **MUST** take a First-Year Seminar (FSEM)
- Transfer students are exempt from the First-Year Seminar

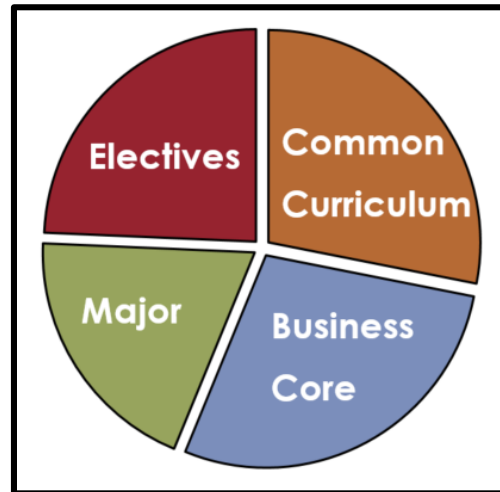
