



# CAMPUS SAFETY ALERT

**Nature:** Sex Assault, Robbery

**Date of Incident:** March 10, 2019 early morning hours

**Location of Incident:** 2400 E. Asbury Ave. University House Apartments

**Synopsis:** In the early morning hours of Sunday, March 10, 2019, A Campus Safety Officer was flagged down in the 1700 block of south High street by a student who appeared to be in distress. After further investigation, the student reported being sexually assaulted and robbed by four males, unaffiliated with the university. The robbery and sex assault occurred earlier, near 2400 E. Asbury Ave, University House Apartments. The assault took place in the suspect's vehicle near campus. The Denver Police responded and took over the investigation from Campus Safety.

**Description of Suspects:** One white male, three black males driving a white Nissan SUV.

## **Sexual assault is never the fault of the victim. While nothing is failsafe, here are some items that everyone should consider:**

- Perpetrators choose victims for their vulnerability, not how they look or act. Sexual assault is a crime of hostility and violence toward the victim. People often engage in victim blaming. It is a way to preserve the false belief that they will be safe from sexual assault "if only" they do not do what the victim did. However, sexual assault is never the victim's fault. **Only the perpetrator chooses to commit sexual assault.**
- Be active in supporting a safe and respectful community. If you see others engaging in disrespectful or inappropriate actions, speak up and get involved, or contact someone else to assist.
- If you would like more information about how to be an active bystander, please participate in "[Intervene](#)".
- Forcing sexual contact on another person without consent is against the law and against university policy. Someone who is passed out, unconscious or incapacitated because of drugs or alcohol is unable to give consent. Sex without consent is sexual assault. Sexual assault is never the victim's fault.
- Trust your instincts. If you feel uneasy or sense something is wrong, call for help.

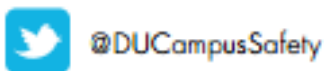
