



# CAMPUS SAFETY ALERT

**Nature:** Burglary

**Date of Incident:** 4/26/2019 – 4/28/2019

**Location of Incident:** 1770 S. Williams Street (Centennial Towers)

**Synopsis:** On Monday, April 29, 2019, the Division of Campus Safety received a report of a Burglary to a student's dorm room in Centennial Towers. The incident occurred sometime between the dates of Friday, April 26, 2019 at 1:00 p.m. to Sunday, April 28, 2019 in the afternoon hours. A laptop was reported stolen from inside the student's dorm room. There is no signs of forcible entry and no suspect information at this time. The victim has been provided with resources for law enforcement reporting.

In response to this incident, the Division of Campus Safety is providing information regarding safety and security tips and this alert as mandated by federal law. This information is general in nature, and has no relation to this specific incident.

## **Safety and Security Tips:**

1. **Be aware of your surroundings. If you see anyone suspicious, avoid them by entering a public place such as a business.**
2. **Do not use your phone or any other electronics when walking. These devices distract you and make you an easy target for criminals.**
3. **Avoid displaying large amounts of cash, or wearing/displaying valuable jewelry or electronics. These items are enticing to criminals who assume that you have more valuables in your possession.**
4. **Try to walk in well-lit areas as much as possible.**
5. **Walk on the sidewalk whenever possible. Walk close to the curb, avoiding doorways, bushes and other potential hiding places.**
