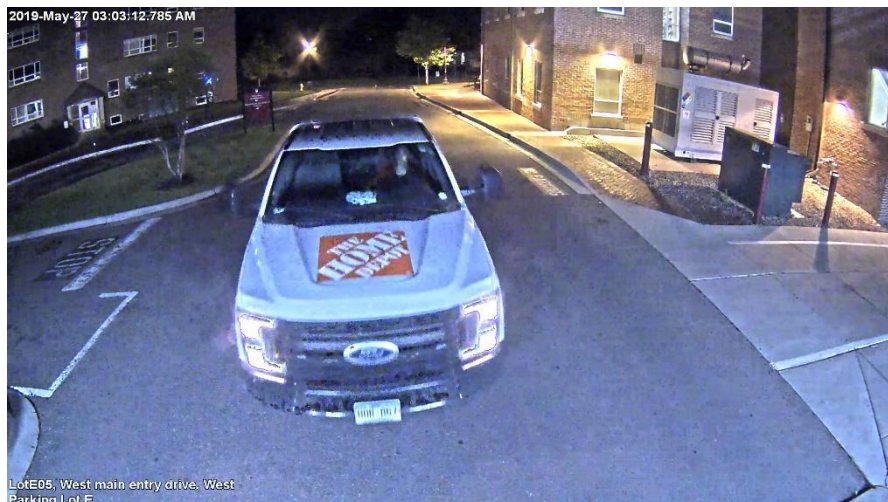
Synopsis: On Monday, May 27 at approximately 3:00 a.m. Denver Police responded to a report of a shooting at 2000 South University (the Conoco located at University Blvd. and Asbury Ave). After meeting with the victim, unaffiliated with the University, they discovered that a man in a F250 flatbed Home Depot rental (license plate BOR 867) pulled up next to her attempting to get her attention at the gas pumps. He then exposed himself and she noticed he was masturbating. As she attempted to leave, the man shot a firearm at her vehicle blowing out the driver's side window.

The suspect is thought to have been involved in other crimes within the vicinity of the University. While the victim is not affiliated with the University, due to the proximity of the incident to campus, we are sharing this information.

This crime is being investigated by the Denver Police Department.

Description of Suspect: Thin build, Caucasian or Hispanic male, approximately 20 years of age. Faded hair style.

Safety and Security Tips:

1. Be aware of your surroundings. If you see anyone suspicious, avoid them by entering a public place such as a business.
2. Do not use your phone or any other electronics when walking. These devices distract you and make you an easy target for criminals.
3. Avoid displaying large amounts of cash, or wearing/displaying valuable jewelry or electronics. These items are enticing to criminals who assume that you have more valuables in your possession.
4. Try to walk in well-lit areas as much as possible.
5. Walk on the sidewalk whenever possible. Walk close to the curb, avoiding doorways, bushes and other potential hiding places.
