Nature: Motor Vehicle Theft; Weapons; Firing/Discharging Weapons

Date of Incident: Thursday, February 13, 2020

Location of Incident: Parking Lot E/301

Synopsis: On Wednesday, Feb 12, 2020, at approximately 4:13 a.m., Campus Safety Officers heard what sounded like gunshots nearby. Immediately after, they were dispatched and responded to parking lot E/301 on the report of a stolen golf cart. Once on scene, they found three shell casings 20 feet away on the pavement. Given that the report of the stolen golf cart and gunshots came in almost simultaneously and because their locations were close by, the events are believed to be connected.

Campus Safety delayed sending the information contained in this alert due to an active investigation by DPD.

There is no suspect description at this time.

Firearms are prohibited on University of Denver property.

Safety and Security Tips:

- 1. Be aware of your surroundings. If you see anyone suspicious, avoid them by entering a public place such as a business.
- 2. Do not use your phone or any other electronics when walking. These devices distract you and make you an easy target for criminals.
- 3. Avoid displaying large amounts of cash, or wearing/displaying valuable jewelry or electronics. These items are enticing to criminals who assume that you have more valuables in your possession.
- 4. Try to walk in well-lit areas as much as possible.
- 5. Walk on the sidewalk whenever possible. Walk close to the curb, avoiding doorways, bushes and other potential hiding places.
