



# CAMPUS SAFETY ALERT

**Nature:** Motor Vehicle Theft; Autos  
**Date of Incident:** Sunday, March 15, 2020  
**Location of Incident:** Parking lot "108"

**Synopsis:** On Monday, March 16, 2020 at approximately 4:49 p.m., a Campus Safety Officer took a report of a motor vehicle theft. The student reported that the last time he saw his vehicle was on Friday, March 13, 2020 at approximately 3:00 p.m. The student informed Campus Safety that his vehicle, a 2000 Honda CRV was parked in parking lot 108.

Campus Safety saw broken glass near where the vehicle was parked. After looking through camera footage, it was determined that the vehicle was stolen on Sunday, March 15, 2020 by two male suspects.

The student filed a case with the Denver Police Department. The victim has been provided resources. This information is being shared with the community per federal law.

#### **Description of Suspects:**

1<sup>st</sup> suspect description: White male, dark colored hair and beard, wearing a blue ball cap, dark sweatshirt with a white strip down the arms, dark pants and white shoes.

2<sup>nd</sup> suspect description: limited description due to footage: dark colored shirt and pants.

#### **Safety and Security Tips:**

1. **Be aware of your surroundings. If you see anyone suspicious, avoid them by entering a public place such as a business.**
2. **Do not use your phone or any other electronics when walking. These devices distract you and make you an easy target for criminals.**
3. **Avoid displaying large amounts of cash, or wearing/displaying valuable jewelry or electronics. These items are enticing to criminals who assume that you have more valuables in your possession.**
4. **Try to walk in well-lit areas as much as possible.**
5. **Walk on the sidewalk whenever possible. Walk close to the curb, avoiding doorways, bushes and other potential hiding places.**
