Nature: Indecent Exposure Incidents

Date of Incident: April 26, 2020 – May 18, 2020

Location of Incident: Various locations within close proximity of the university campus

Synopsis: Over the past three weeks, DU Campus Safety has seen an increase in reports of indecent exposure incidents within close proximity to the University campus. It is undetermined if the incidents are related at this time.

Description of Suspects: There is limited suspect information in each of the associated incidents. A suspect in one incident is described as a medium build white or Hispanic male, wearing a black baseball cap, grey sweat shirt with a yellow safety vest over the top of the sweatshirt, blue jeans, and tan or brown work boots. The suspect in a separate incident was described as a white male, approximately 40 years old, around 5'9", wearing a gray hoodie and sweatpants. The suspect in a third incident was described as a white male, wearing black sweatpants and a hoodie.

The safety of our students and community is our primary concern. DU Campus Safety is aiding the Denver Police Department with an investigation into these incidents. Safety and Security Tips:

- 1. If you see anyone suspicious, avoid them by entering a public place such as a business. Report suspicious activity to the Division of Campus Safety at 303-871-2334 and the Denver Police Police Department at 720.913.2000.
- 2. Be aware of your surrounding in an out of your residence. Consider closing windows and pulling blinds or curtains to maximize privacy.
- 3. Do not use your phone or any other electronics when walking. These devices distract you and make you an easy target for criminals.
- 4. Try to walk in well-lit areas as much as possible.
- 5. Walk on the sidewalk whenever possible. Walk close to the curb, avoiding doorways, bushes and other potential hiding places.
