Nature: Stalking
Date of Incident: Saturday, September 19th until present. Various incidents
Location of Incident: Various locations, nearby off campus residence and business, Coors Fitness Center

Synopsis: On Tuesday, October 6, 2020 Campus Safety received a report regarding a stalking incident on campus. After the initial investigation, it was linked back to three previous incidents that have taken place within the past month off campus. This led us to believe that there have been extensive cases of stalking by this individual.

The reports of stalking include both on and near off campus locations. The suspect has physically walked up to people's residences, approached them in nearby businesses and followed others through the Coors Fitness Center. The suspect has a pattern of being forward, asking for a date and phone number, and then following in several instances. The suspect is believed to have touched a student's arm and leg yesterday.

Campus Safety and the Denver Police Department are investigating these incidents.

Description of Suspect:

White male, short dark hair, dark eyes, dark complexion, 25-30 years of age, medium build, medium complexion, 5'7 – 5'9.

Safety and Security Tips:

1. **Be aware of your surroundings. If you see anyone suspicious, avoid them by entering a public place such as a business.**
2. **Do not use your phone or any other electronics when walking. These devices distract you and make you an easy target for criminals.**
3. **Avoid displaying large amounts of cash or wearing/displaying valuable jewelry or electronics. These items are enticing to criminals who assume that you have more valuables in your possession.**
4. **Try to walk in well-lit areas as much as possible.**

- 5. Walk on the sidewalk whenever possible. Walk close to the curb, avoiding doorways, bushes and other potential hiding places.

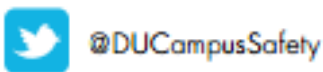
