

## **Frequently Asked Questions**

### **Additional Vaccination and Vaccination Requirements**

**Will fully vaccinated individuals need to wear masks and socially distance?** Because public health guidance is still evolving, we do not know at this time whether fully vaccinated individuals will need to continue wearing masks in the fall. Because we no longer expect to be de-densified in the fall, we do not plan to require fully vaccinated individuals to social distance.

**Where do I submit my proof of COVID-19 vaccination?**

Upload your completed vaccine card at the [myhealth.du.edu](https://myhealth.du.edu) portal.

**What is the deadline for providing proof of vaccination?**

The deadline to upload proof of vaccination is your return date to campus for fall term or September 1, 2021, whichever is sooner.

**What other vaccines does DU require?**

Historically, DU has required students submit proof of vaccination for MMR (measles, mumps, rubella). For winter term 2021, we required proof of vaccination for the flu. We are requiring MMR, flu and COVID-19 vaccination for fall of 2021.

**What if I lost my proof of my COVID-19 vaccination?**

Contact the provider through which you received your vaccination(s) to obtain replacement proof of vaccination.

**Do I still need to submit proof if I got vaccinated on campus?**

Yes.

**What does “fully vaccinated” mean?**

Individuals are considered fully vaccinated two weeks after receiving a one-dose COVID-19 vaccine or two weeks after receiving the second of a two-dose vaccine. It will also include any booster recommendations as those are determined. It is after being fully vaccinated when individuals need to submit their completed vaccination card on the [myhealth.du.edu](https://myhealth.du.edu) portal.

**Some people experience temporary (and normal) symptoms after receiving the COVID-19 vaccination. Can I be excused from work/class if I feel unwell after receiving my vaccination?**

Yes, you can use your sick or vacation leave as available to cover any absence from work made necessary by receiving the COVID-19 vaccine. Contact your HR Partner with any additional questions.
