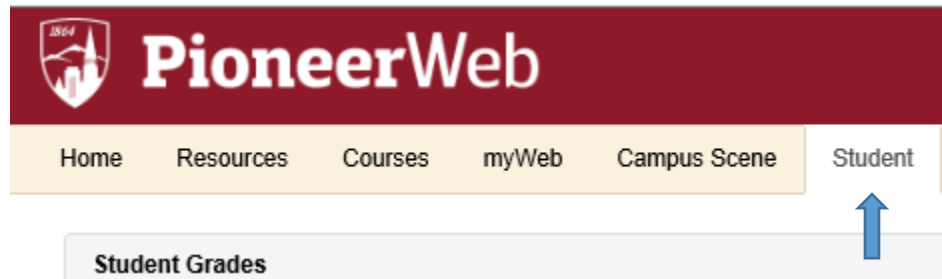


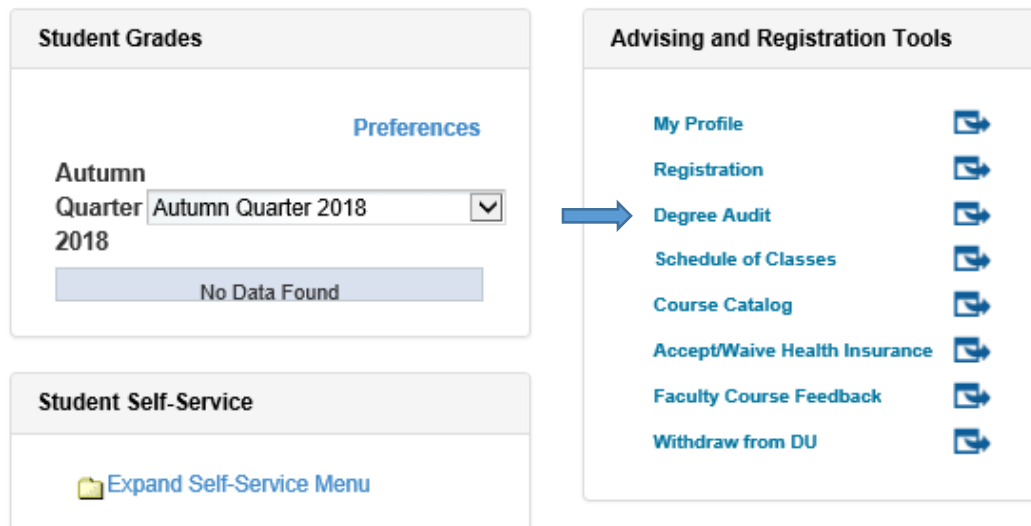
Degree Audit for New Students

The Degree Audit helps you track the requirements for your degree. Your audit will show you how your completed course work, transferred credits and current in progress credits are counting toward your declared degree. You can also run a "What-If" audit to explore other majors and degree programs, to see what credits you've completed will count toward the new degree.

To access your Degree Audit login to PioneerWeb and click on the Student Tab.

Overall Requirements

At the very top is the Overall Requirements. Overall Requirements includes the minimum number of credits, as well as the minimum GPA that must be earned in order to earn your degree. The “Required” column denotes what must be earned. The “Applied” column denotes your current progress towards those requirements.

As seen in the image above, a Bachelor of Arts requires a minimum of 183 total credit hours and a minimum GPA of 2.0 (grade of C average) in order to earn the credential. This student has 173 credits (84 credits, of which, that were taken at the University of Denver) and a GPA of 3.46. This student needs to successfully complete 10 more credit hours in order to meet the Overall Degree Requirements.

What-If Degree Audit

If you are thinking of changing your major or minor, the 'what-if' audit can be very beneficial for you. It will help you see how your audit will change once you switch your program elements. This is a useful tool in determining where your previous courses would count in the new degree to see if you are on the right track towards graduation.

The 'what-if' audit allows you to hypothetically change your program elements and see how the courses that you have taken or transferred will fit in to that new program.

For example, if you are currently enrolled in a Bachelor of Arts with a major in Psychology and you were thinking of changing your major to Art, you can run a 'what-if' audit. This will allow you to see how your current credits would fit into a Bachelor of Arts with a major in Art.

To access a What-if analysis, go to your degree audit as explained on [page 1](#), and click on the "What-If Analysis" link, seen below.
