



# CAMPUS SAFETY ALERT

**Nature:** Peeping/Voyeurism, Home Invasion (Separate Incidents)  
**Date of Incident:** March 15 and 16, 2022  
**Location of Incident:** Near off campus

## Synopsis:

Two separate incidents occurred on Wednesday, March 16, 2022. This morning around midnight, Campus Safety responded to University Boulevard and Asbury Avenue on a peeping/voyeurism incident. Students living in this area reported that shortly before midnight on March 15, they discovered a man crouching just outside of their window with a phone or camera. One of the residents ran outside and saw the man, who appeared to be alone, get into a black Ford Explorer and drive off. The suspect was described as a slim, white male with a goatee in his late 20s to mid-30s. He was reported to be wearing a black or dark colored hooded sweatshirt or jacket. A report was filed with the Denver Police Department.

A later incident was reported to Campus Safety around 6am in a different off-campus residence. A person broke into a student's residence at Evans Avenue and Clayton Street. The student was able to avoid the intruder by locking themselves inside of their bathroom. Police responded to this location as well. No suspect description was received for this incident.

This information is being shared with the community per federal law.

## Safety and Security Tips:

These safety and security tips are strategies for reducing risk and victimization is never the fault of the victim/survivor.

1. **Be aware of your surroundings. If you see anyone suspicious, avoid them by entering a public place such as a business.**
2. **Use outdoor lighting where possible at your residence.**
3. **Avoid displaying large amounts of cash or wearing/displaying valuable jewelry or electronics. These items are enticing to criminals who assume that you have more valuables in your possession.**
4. **Use a timer to cycle lights on and off inside residences.**
5. **Close and lock windows and pull drapes/shades shut at night and when away.**
6. **Lock exterior residence doors at all times.**

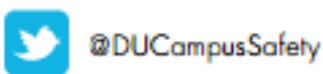
