## Synopsis:

On May 4, 2022, Campus Safety received reports of stolen credit cards and other personal items out of University Hall and Ammi Hyde. These incidents are being investigated by the Denver Police Department.

On May 5, 2022, two thefts from vehicles occurred on the 1700 block of South Williams Street. The items stolen were in plain view.

The victims of these crimes have been provided resources for law enforcement reporting. This information is being shared with the community per federal law.

There is no suspect description at this time.

### Safety and Security Tips:

These safety and security tips are strategies for reducing risk and victimization is never the fault of the victim/survivor.

1. Always secure your valuables and personal belongings in a locked cabinet.
2. Never leave your office door propped open.
3. Avoid displaying large amounts of cash or wearing/displaying valuable jewelry or electronics. These items are enticing to criminals who assume that you have more valuables in your possession.
4. Avoid thefts of opportunity – opportunity theft is the direct result of valuables left unattended and unsecured, even for short periods of time, which provides a thief with the opportunity to steal your valuables. Opportunity thefts are the most preventable crimes that occur.
5. Close and lock windows and pull drapes/shades shut at night and when away.
6. Avoid suspicious people and report this activity to Campus Safety at 303.871.2334.
