LANGUAGE: TWO OPTIONS

OPTION 1:



ONE YEAR OF COLLEGE-LEVEL COURSES IN THE SAME LANGUAGE SEQUENCE (E.G., ITAL 1001, ITAL 1002, ITAL 1003)

OPTION 2:



ONE COLLEGE-LEVEL COURSE 2000-LEVEL OR HIGHER (AP/IB SCORES **DO NOT** FULFILL LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS)

IF YOU COMPLETED 2 YEARS OF HIGH SCHOOL LANGUAGE STUDY, YOU SHOULD **NOT** TAKE 1001.

LANGUAGE PLACEMENT

- THE PLACEMENT IS **ONE TOOL** TO HELP YOU FIND THE BEST MATCH FOR YOUR BACKGROUND.
 - You can take the French, German, Russian, and Spanish placements up to 5 times within a 7-day window.
 - The Center for World Languages and Cultures (CWLC) recommends students take the French and Spanish placement 2-3 times. The highest score will be the one that determines placement.
 - Other language placements cannot be taken more than once.
 - **ADDITIONAL TOOLS TO CONFIRM PLACEMENT INCLUDE:**
 - The Director of the Center for World Languages and Cultures (CWLC@du.edu)
 - Completing language advising during Discoveries Orientation the week before fall classes begin.
 - Meeting with the professor for your class in week 1
