Dates of Incidents: 12/2/2024 at 5:28 PM and 12/11/2024 at 5:04 PM

Location of Incident: Parking Lot 504 between University Apartments South and University Apartments North

Synopsis:

On Monday, December 2, 2024, at approximately 5:28 PM, an individual lit bushes on fire between University Apartments South and University Apartments North. On Wednesday, December 11, 2024, at approximately 5:04 PM, an individual started a dumpster fire in the parking lot between the same apartments. Campus Safety has reason to believe the fires were set intentionally and the same person started both fires. No one was injured by either arson incident, but both caused property damage.

Campus Safety is sending this alert pursuant to the Clery Act. The suspect in these criminal acts was not apprehended and could pose a continuing threat to our campus community.
