Synopsis:

On Wednesday, April 9th at approximately 3:11 PM, the individual pictured below lit a dumpster on fire at Beta Theta Pi. At 3:50 PM, Campus Safety responded to another fire in a stairwell at Knudson Hall. Campus Safety has reason to believe both fires were set intentionally, and the same person started them. No one was injured by either arson incident.

Campus Safety is sending this alert pursuant to the Clery Act. The suspect in these criminal acts was not apprehended and could pose a continuing arson threat to our campus community.
