Synopsis:

On June 25th, the individual pictured below entered a locker room at the Peter Barton Lacrosse Stadium and stole a jersey. The individual was arrested by the Denver Police Department for this burglary, but they have already been released from custody.

The University has issued a trespass order prohibiting them from being present on DU property; however, they have been seen on campus on multiple occasions in the last few days. If you see this individual, please notify the Department of Campus Safety immediately by calling our emergency line at 303-871-3000.

Campus Safety is sending this alert pursuant to the Clery Act. This individual could pose a continuing threat to our campus community.

3. Use outdoor lighting where possible at your residence.
4. Use a timer to cycle lights on and off inside residences.
5. Close and lock windows and pull drapes/shades shut at night and when away.
