

Common Curriculum

The University of Denver grants credit for select Advanced Placement (AP) and International Baccalaureate (IB) examination scores as well as previous college coursework through enrollment in college-level courses. Incoming students should submit AP and IB scores and college transcripts prior to registration so that we can help place students in the correct courses.

Undergraduate Admissions will send you an initial credit evaluation, which will indicate what courses will automatically transfer for credit at DU.

Pending credits? Don't repeat the same class.
