INTS Major Requirements

First Year Seminar (FSEM)

Required for all first-year students

Core (8 credits)

INTS 1500: Introduction to Global Economy

INTS 1700: Introduction to International Politics

Skills (8 credits)

INTS 2975: Global Issues Research Practicum

Specialization (12 credits)

Students take 3 classes (12 credits) from within one of the seven standing specializations or can create a unique one with advisor approval.

Supporting Courses (Electives) (16 credits)

16 credits of INTS approved courses outside of the student's specialization. Internship credit is optional and available.

Students are required to complete an approved study abroad program
